

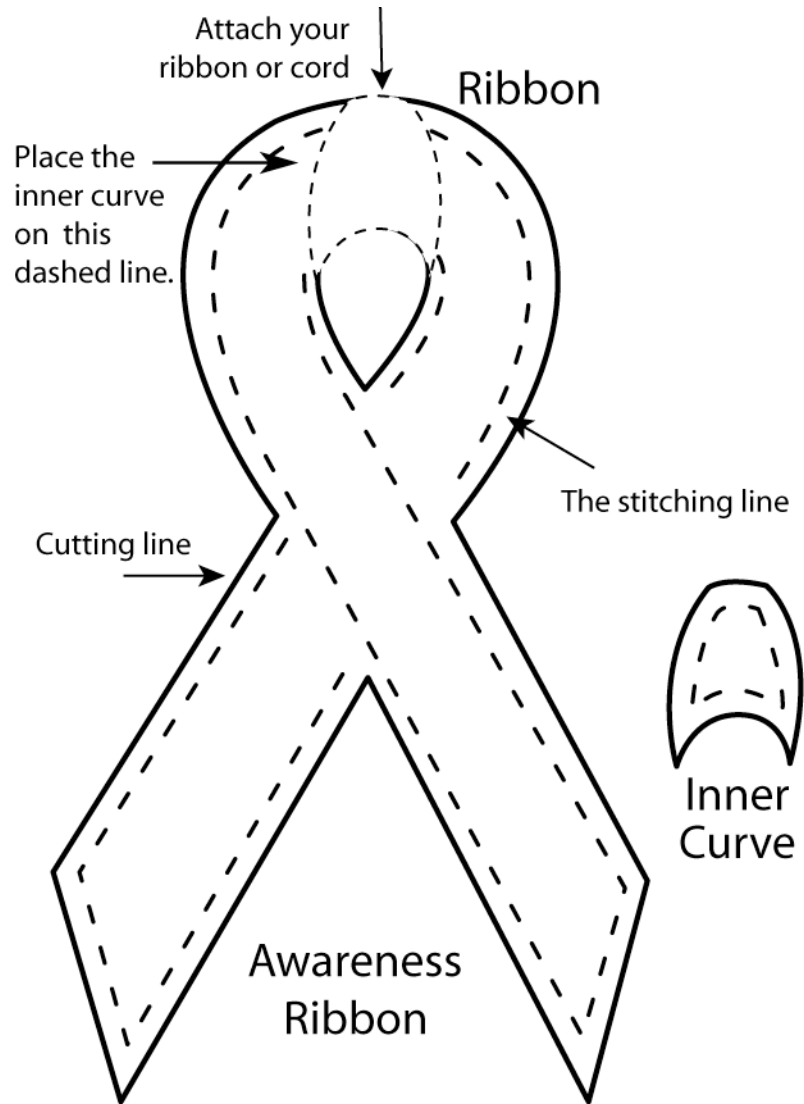


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STITCH 'EM UP™  
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Ornament Series 3  
Awareness Ribbon  
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### Pattern Pieces and Diagrams



Ornament Series 3  
Awareness Ribbon  
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**Fabrics:** fleece, flannel, heavy cotton, and felt. We like fleece the best, but for a kids group project, felt would be perfect.

**Filler:** batting or heavy flannel.

**Thread:** button twist, quilting, embroidery, candlelight, embroidery floss, regular sewing thread.

**Hanger:** 10" or ribbon, cording, yarn etc.

**Optional:** Tear-away stabilizer, tissue paper, typing paper

The look you want will determine your fabric, filler and thread choices. There really are no rules ☺.

### Instructions

1. Determine your fabric and batting.
2. Transfer the pattern shapes to your fabric and cut out. Cut out 2 of the Ribbon; cut out one of the Inner Band.
3. Transfer the Ribbon pattern shape to your filler and cut out.
4. Trim these filler pieces 1/8" to 1/4" smaller than your original size. This will allow you to stitch them down without the filler showing beyond the fabric.
5. If you want to embroider someone's name onto the Ribbon you need to do it now, before assembling the ornament.
6. Sew the inner band to the ribbon where noted on the pattern.
7. Put the ribbon unit together (front – filler – back) and pin.
8. Take your 10" hanger medium, fold in half and pin into place as show on the pattern diagram. About 1" of the hanger needs to be inside or to the filler side of the ribbon.
9. Sew the ribbon together as shown on the black & white illustration.
10. Remove any pins, make sure your hanger is secure – and hang your "Awareness Ribbon" ornament.

If you're going to use "Awareness Ribbon" as a project for kids, you can do away with any batting or filler. Use felt for the bottle and embroidery floss for the kids to sew by hand.
